


Twigworth Green Residents invited to meeting!

Twigworth Green residents (Phase I only) have been invited by the **Gateway Management Company** to attend a "Welcome Meeting" at the Norton Village Hall on 30th July 2024 starting at 18:30hrs.



Gateway are the company who will be managing the upkeep of the Twigworth Green Development "Management Areas" which all residents will contribute towards each year.

It will be an opportunity to ask questions about how this will be managed and what can be expected.

Gateway have stated that questions can be emailed in advance and they will answer these at the meeting.

Defibrillator Update!

The Parish Council have now purchased a Defibrillator for Twigworth, Council members just need to approve the Policy Agreement at their next meeting in July and with the kind



permission of Janes Pantry and Robert Hitchins, the Defibrillator will be installed outside Janes Pantry, Twigworth Local Centre by the end of July.

The Defibrillator is fully automatic and will be registered on the National Register; it will be available 24/7 for emergencies.

Anyone can use a Defibrillator, you do not need training, once you turn it on, it will give clear step-by-step voice instructions.

Sports Pavilion

Work has now started on a Sports Pavilion facility, which will serve the new sports pitches at Twigworth Green.

Around £850,000 is being invested, plans for the development include a club committee room, two changing rooms with showers, plus a veranda, a car park and cycle storage outside.

Twigworth Remembers - 80 D-Day Commemoration







Today is our country's opportunity to remember over 209,000 Allied casualties of Operation Overlord. This includes nearly 37,000 ground forces and 16,714 air forces killed in the invasion of Normandy's Utah, Omaha, Gold, Juno and Sword beaches, and the long and bloody campaign that followed.

The Tribute

Let us remember those who gave their lives at home and abroad during the D-Day landings, whose sacrifice enables us all to enjoy the peace and freedom we have today.

Let us remember those who came home wounded, physically and mentally, and the friends and family who cared for them.

Let us remember those who returned to restore their relationships and rebuild their working lives after years of conflict and turmoil.

Let us remember the families that lost husbands, wives, sons, daughters and sweethearts.

Let us remember the servicemen and women and merchant seafarers of all nationalities - from all countries - who fought, suffered and died during the D-Day landings and six years of war.

Let us all remember those in the Royal Navy, Army, Royal Air Force, Merchant Navy, and our Allies - the brave people who kept us safe on the home front and abroad and those in reserved occupations during the difficult time of war.

Let us remember the brave doctors and nurses who cared for the wounded, the men and women who toiled in the fields, the coal mines, the factories and the air raid wardens, police officers, firemen, ambulance drivers and the young people of the Scouts and Guides who all played such a vital role in the war.

On Thursday 6th June 2024, at 09:00hrs the Twigworth Parish Council, joined in the national commemorations of the 80th anniversary of the D-Day landings.

On behalf of residents, Cllr Rick Harris raised the 80 D-Day Commemoration Flag of Peace at St Matthews Church.

Cllr John Redfern read The Tribute as part of the ceremony.

The ceremony was also attended by Councillors Elaine Watson and Graham Bocking, together with local residents.

Later this year, on 9th November, the community will come together once again, to remember those who fought and died for our country, details will be published nearer the date.

Dogs - Safety Concern!

There have been a few instances recently where dog owners have not had their dogs on a leash in residential areas, this can be concerning for anyone who is not a dog lover and it may put children or other people at risk.

Remember too, it is just not people, it is also about the interaction with other dogs, as not all are friendly, some can be aggressive, others nervous and anxious, unless you know the dog, treat with caution.

We also have a number of busy roads and there are concerns about road safety too; dog owners have a responsibility to keep their dogs under control at all times.

We are fortunate to have open fields on our doorstep where there are plenty opportunities to let your dogs have a run safely.

A38 Footpath Safety!

Everyone who lives in Twigworth knows how dangerous it is when you walk the footpath along the A₃8 with the speed of traffic and heavy transport that passes daily.



Overgrown hedges make it impossible for pedestrians to pass safely without stepping onto the road with traffic travelling at speed. This makes for a very unsafe passage for anyone in a wheelchair or for those with small children in a pushchair.

We reported this issue to GCC Highways and are pleased to report that the hedges have now been cut back.

Latest Planning Applications

24/00457/FUL | Removal/Variation of Conditions 12 of Appeal Ref: APP/G1630/W/23/3326538, Application Ref 22/01343/OUT | Chestnut Tree Farm, Tewkesbury Road Twigworth

Removal of the wording "These details will be consistent with the principle that no dwelling is to connect to the public sewer (for foul sewage only) until upgrades have been carried out to the public sewerage system" so that the revised conditions reads as:-

"12. Prior to the commencement of development, drainage plans for the disposal of foul water shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the local planning authority. The submitted details will also ensure that no surface water is to be discharged into the public sewerage system. None of the dwellings hereby approved shall be first occupied until the foul water drainage scheme has been implemented in accordance with the approved details."
